

# Musgrove Park Library Service

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## Summary:

Two articles of interest from the BMJ highlight that [the impact of long term COVID-19 symptoms will be profound](#), and that [during the lockdown England saw fewer cases of cold, flu and bronchitis](#).

Articles from the New England Journal of Medicine and JAMA respectively focus on [COVID-19 and the mandate to redefine preventive care](#) and the [Effect of an inactivated vaccine against SARS-CoV-2 on safety and immunogenicity outcomes- interim analysis of 2 randomised clinical trials](#)

This article from the HSJ discusses the [contact tracing app which is being trialled in London borough of Newham, and the Isle of Wight](#). The app will give a risk score based on where people live and how many others they have interacted with.

An article from the British Journal of General practice looks at a [study of the reorganisation of primary care for older adults during COVID-19](#), and the impact on people accessing services.

[A report from the King's Fund](#) looks at the development of technology and innovation for long-term health conditions, highlighting the rate at which NHS services moved online during lockdown and asking how we can maintain this change going forward.

NHS England have published a short news piece discussing [the roll out of COVID-19-friendly cancer treatments](#), the aim being that these new drugs will have less of an impact on patients' immune systems and will require fewer hospital visits. These are "swaps" for existing cancer treatments.

The Health Foundation have published two reports, one discussing [the importance of supporting staff wellbeing during COVID-19](#), giving an example from a Northumbrian hospital and another which looks at [how we can understand the changes to mortality rates during the pandemic](#).

Two pieces from NHS Confederation focus on [The impact of COVID-19 on community health services](#) and the introduction of [NHS Reset, a new campaign to help shape the digital offer of healthcare services following the pandemic](#).

**The Oxford Vaccine:** The latest news and research about Oxford University's promising ChAdOx1-nCoV-19 vaccine, which is now being rolled out in phase 3 trials in the UK, Brazil and South Africa.

Of interest also may be the [new rapid risk assessment from the European Centre for Disease Prevention and Control](#), now in its 11<sup>th</sup> update and focusing on the resurgence of COVID-19 cases.

[The COVID-19 Health System Response Monitor](#) continues to be updated with country-specific information around responses to the pandemic, and services as a comparison as to how different countries are responding to the situation.

Finally, the CQC have published their [monthly COVID-19 Insight report for July](#), which contains insights on topics such as mental health service provision, COVID-19 statistics, financial viability and the impact on care services.
